



CPSISC is ensuring that new units of competency covering licensing requirements for High Risk Work are endorsed in the CPC08 Construction Plumbing and Services Integrated Framework Training Package and implemented effectively

The 12 units were developed through a national project managed by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR) and a high level steering group. The units relate to *National Standard for Persons Performing High Risk Work* (April 2006, ASCC) and the relevant licensing units for the construction industry are:

- CPCCLBM3001A License to operate a concrete placing boom
- CPCCLDG3001A License to perform dogging
- CPCCLHS3001A License to operate a personnel and materials hoist
- CPCCLHS3002A License to operate a materials hoist
- CPCCLRG3001A License to perform rigging – basic level
- CPCCLRG3002A License to perform rigging – intermediate level
- CPCCLRG4001A License to perform rigging – advanced level
- CPCCLSF2001A License to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding – basic level
- CPCCLSF3001A License to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding – intermediate level
- CPCCLSF4001A License to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding – advanced level
- CPCCLTC4001A License to operate a tower crane
- CPCCLTC4002A License to operate a self-erecting tower crane

Currently the units have been formatted to meet DEEWR requirements and kept up to date with final changes provided by the steering group.

When endorsed, continuous improvement work will be undertaken to make the units available in all jurisdictions so appropriate RTOs can have them on their scope of registration and provide training and assessment services.

CPSISC will review implementation of the new units by March 2009 to ensure this is meeting the needs of industry and OHS regulators.
